

REGISTRATION INFORMATION AND FORMS

REGISTRATION

The registration form and fee must be received by the AAFPRS Foundation office by **March 1, 2002**, in order to qualify for the pre-registration fee. After that date you will be charged the on-site fee.

Registration fees for physicians and facial plastic surgery assistants include a badge; on-site program; attendance to the Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday scientific sessions; all Breakfast Sessions; entrance to the Exhibit Hall; continental breakfasts, breaks, lunches; the Wednesday Welcome Reception; and the Friday Joint Reception.

Additional fees are required to attend all the Instruction Courses; all optional workshops; the annual PAINT THE TOWN event; and for non-members, the Video Learning Center.

Spouses and Guest fees include a badge; on-site program; entrance to the Exhibit Hall; continental breakfasts, breaks, lunches; and the Welcome Reception on Wednesday and Friday. GETTING THERE

From New York's La Guardia Airport (LGA) (15 miles West)
Take Grand Central Parkway to L.I.E. (Midtown Tunnel) straight up 42nd Street to 8th Avenue. Turn right to 46th Street.

From New York's JF Kennedy Airport (JFK) (15 miles Southwest)
Take Van Wyck Expressway to Grand Central Parkway to L.I.E. (Midtown Tunnel) straight up 42nd Street to 8th Avenue. Turn right on 46th Street.

Newark (EWR) (20 miles West)

Take New Jersey Turnpike to Lincoln Tunnel. Follow signs to 42nd Street (N). Take a left onto 8th Avenue and a right on 46th Street. Proceed straight to hotel.

Driving and parking in New York City can be a challenge. If you prefer not to rent a car, Super Shuttle operates blue and yellow minivans that serve JFK and LaGuardia. Shuttle service is first-come, first-served every 15-30 minutes, 24 hours a day. Between 12:30 a.m. and 5:00 a.m., use a courtesy phone to obtain service. From JFK and LaGuardia the cost is between \$14 and \$17. For more information, please call 800-258-3826.

Taxis are expensive. The approximate fare from Newark to Midtown (not including tip) will cost about \$60.00. From JFK, expect to pay \$30.00 plus tolls, and from LaGuardia \$20.00-\$25.00 will get you there. Do not accept rides in "gypsy" (unofficial) cabs.
