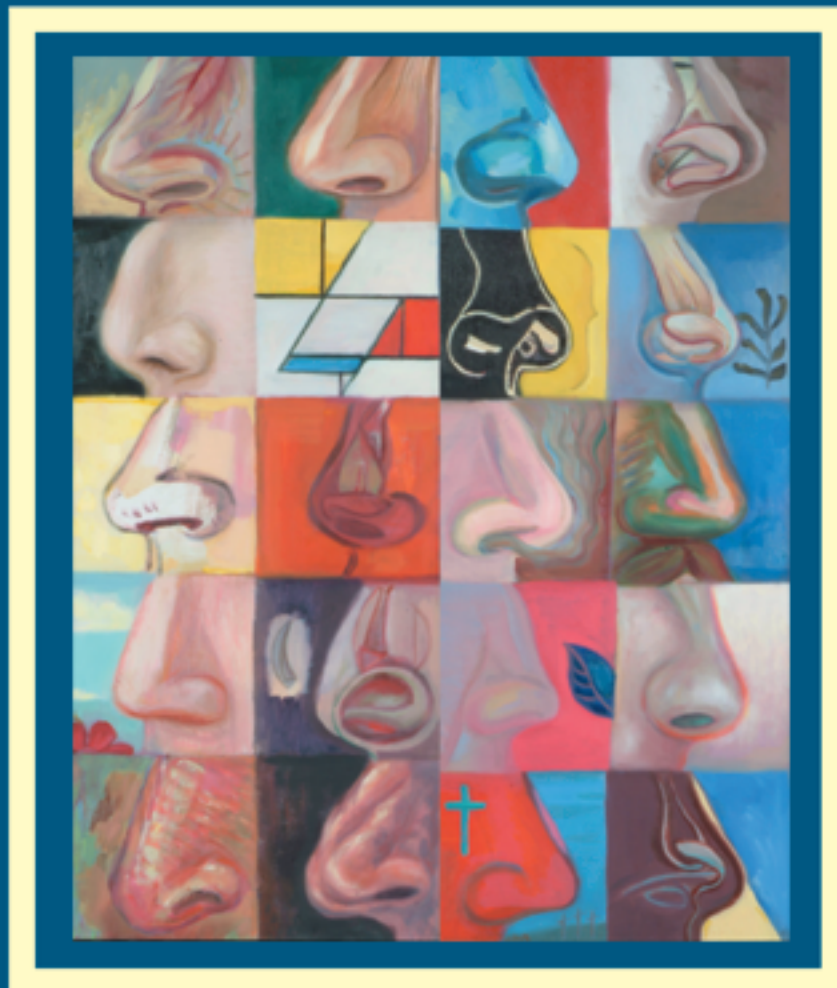

About the Course

Advances in Rhinoplasty is the flagship course sponsored by the Educational and Research Foundation for the American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. This is the fourth and final course to be held in Chicago and will likely be the most memorable. The meeting will be held at the Hyatt Regency Hotel at a peak time to enjoy the spring weather and the many activities along the lakeshore and downtown areas. Chicago is known for its many outstanding, world-class restaurants with a multitude of ethnic options. The program will provide a comprehensive overview of aesthetic and functional rhinoplasty with insights into evaluation and diagnosis, new techniques and technologies, and post-surgical management for rhinoplasty surgery. The course will provide an intense opportunity to learn new techniques and reinforce skills and methods through focused panels and presentations of acknowledged experts in rhinoplasty surgery.

Panels will be practical in nature focusing on patient consultation and patient selection, nasal tip surgery, rhinoplasty case presentations, rhinoplasty analysis, secondary rhinoplasty, and how to maximize your outcomes.

The personal rhinoplasty approach format will provide the faculty with adequate time to thoroughly discuss their rhinoplasty philosophy. Following each personal rhinoplasty presentation, a video-presentation of a rhinoplasty operation will be shown to demonstrate their strategy and technique. These video-presentations will allow maximal educational benefit, efficient use of time, unedited miscues, and critical evaluation of the post-operative outcome.

A new feature of the 2005 course, *How I do It* panels, will incorporate presentations by faculty to cover specific aspects of rhinoplasty such as; profile alignment and osteotomies, approaches to the nose, tip projection, marketing your practice, nasal length, deviated nose, saddle nose deformity, alar base and ethnic rhinoplasty. In this format, the presentations will be linked by discussions between the panelists to provide their opinion on how to manage different problems. These sessions will also feature tightly edited digital video, illustrative case presentations, and audience participation.

The faculty has been selected from both the disciplines of facial plastic surgery and plastic surgery and includes premiere rhinoplasty surgeons of acknowledged, substantial experience and capabilities to ensure a truly advanced and sophisticated educational seminar. The faculty will present practical information including their experiences with complex nasal deformities and suboptimal outcomes that made them better rhinoplasty surgeons. Ample time and opportunity will be afforded for questions/answers as well as consensus and controversy discussions. Refinements in precision diagnosis will be emphasized along with longitudinal, long-term outcomes assessment.

On Monday through Wednesday evening, a video session will be held from 7:30pm to 9:30pm showing operations performed by the faculty. A faculty member who will take questions from the audience will moderate this additional video viewing session.

The day following the didactic segment of the course will be devoted to a full day "hands-on" fresh cadaver dissection laboratory. Two participants will dissect on each fresh cadaver head. The course will feature sequential prosections performed by the faculty demonstrating crucial portions of the rhinoplasty operation. Participants will then go back to their cadaver specimens to execute the maneuvers. The fresh cadaver dissection course will again feature computer stations with digital video clips of over 50 surgical techniques. Primary and secondary faculty will teach at the dissection course providing one-on-one instruction creating a unique teaching environment. Fresh cadaver heads will provide the dissector with unparalleled practical experience in rhinoplasty.

On Friday July 1st, a post-course optional "live surgery" demonstration will provide participants with an exciting and educational day of surgery. Faculty will moderate the live surgery and questions will be taken from the audience to maximize the educational benefit of the demonstrations. Challenging cases will be chosen to provide the participants with many helpful technical points.

We have worked hard to make this an outstanding educational experience with the world-class faculty, comprehensive program, fresh cadaver dissection lab, and "live surgery." We hope to see you in Chicago in June.

Who Should Attend

This course is designed for those surgical specialists who wish to enhance their knowledge and skills in rhinoplasty surgery. Facial plastic surgeons and plastic surgeons will find this course valuable as it presents the basic foundations of rhinoplasty combined with advanced surgical challenges. The interdisciplinary faculty will provide multiple viewpoints for many rhinoplasty situations. Registrants may choose to participate in cadaver dissection labs and observe live surgery.

Learning Objectives

Registrants should be better able to:

1. Understand normal and variant nasal anatomy as it applies to reconstructive and cosmetic rhinoplasty.
2. Apply aesthetic and functional diagnostic skills to varied rhinoplasty problems.
3. More accurately select appropriate candidates for rhinoplasty.
4. Apply sound and tested surgical techniques to obtain predictable outcomes.
5. Understand and recognize complications, applying successful methods to correct these defects.

Needs Statement

Based on focus groups and evaluation data, we know that the need for instruction in advanced rhinoplasty continues to grow. We have also identified a need for more in-depth instructional opportunities with the most experienced faculty. This course has been designed to respond to these needs with internationally renowned faculty allotted sufficient time to instruct in detail.

Accreditation and Credit Designation
